At our March 7 Club Luncheon, we heard from Jessica Barlament, Executive Director of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Washington County.

Jessica Barlament, Executive Director of Big Brothers Big Sisters Washington County is presented a \$200 donation from the Optimist Club by Club President, Laura Eggert



Jessica explained that Big Brothers Big Sisters of Washington County (BBBS) was founded in 1969, and is dedicated to "connecting volunteers with children to help them empower every child for their brightest future." She further added that BBBS develops positive enduring relationships that have a direct and lasting effect on the lives of young people. Jessica also shared some basic statistics:

- ❖ Of the children BBBS serves
 - 67% are Ages 6-12,
 - 33% are Ages 13-18
 - 51% are Girls,
 - 49% are Boys
- ❖ BBBS "Bigs" volunteer together an estimated 8,000 hours each year.
- ❖ BBBS facilitates 60 new matches each year.
- ❖ BBBS impact touches over 3,500 lives collectively in Washington County annually.
- ❖ BBBS makes 6,120 contacts (phone, email, in person) each year, ensuring child safety with Mentor, Parent, and Youth.

Also at our March 7 Club Luncheon, we had a presentation from Lori Prescott, Executive Director of Family Promise of Washington County. Lori shared that Family Promise of Washington County was started in 2009 and is a community



organization working to prevent homelessness. It provides resources and services to individuals and families at risk and aims to rebuild lives. It provides safe and stable housing solutions. It is committed to assisting and supporting those experiencing homelessness from their initial call for help until they secure housing. At the start of 2024, the new, expanded "Promise Center" located at 450 E Water Street in West Bend, officially opened. This offers shelter for men, women and families, as well as a walk-in resource center for community members at large. All homelessness services and offices are now in one convenient location.

On March 16, Club President Laura Eggert and Club Secretary Greg Harding joined with our Charter Boy Scout Troop 796 at the Tower Heritage Center Circuit Courtroom for the "Eagle Scout Court of Honor" award celebration. Three scouts, Samuel Davis, Gabriel Klenner, and Rodrigo Cardenas-Delgado, were recognized for having

achieved "Eagle Scout" status.

Eagle Scout is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouts of America. To merit this rank, the Boy Scout must fulfil requirements in the areas of *Leadership, Service*, and *Outdoor Skills*, and must demonstrate *Scout Spirit* (an ideal attitude based upon the Scout Oath and Law). He must earn at least 21 *merit badges*, 14 of which are mandatory. The Scout must also complete an extensive *service project* that the Scout plans, manages, and completes.

The Service Projects by these new Eagle Scouts:

- Samuel Davis constructed a pedestrian bridge at Bicentennial Park
- Gabriel Klenner built a 400 foot boardwalk at Sandy Knoll County Park
- Rodrigo Cardenas-Delgado made a 90 foot boardwalk for the disk golf course at Sandy Knoll County Park

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ANSWERS - Math Word-Puzzles

- 1. The farmer has three sheep, two goats, and one horse. How to solve: s = # sheep; g = # goats; h = # horses
- there are three animals that are not sheep, thus g + h
- there are four animals that are not goats, thus s + h
- there are five animals that are not horses, thus s + g
- g + h = 3

$$s + h = 4$$

$$s + g = 5$$

Solve Logically: In s + h = 4, one number must be 3 and the other number must be 1 because there is always a different number of each animal, thus it can't be 2 + 2; and therefore, there is one horse because if there were 3 horses then g + h would be greater than 3.

• So h = 1

$$g+1 = 3$$
, so $g = 2$,

$$s+2 = 5$$
, so $s = 3$

Solve algebraically:

	h = 3 - g	s + (3 - g) = 4	(1 + g) + g = 5	
		s + 3 - g = 4	1 + 2g = 5	
		s-g=1	2g = 4

	<u>h = 1</u>	<u>s = 3</u>		

- 2. Older brother-ob is 17 & the younger brother-yb is 7. **Solve Logically:**
 - 1st. Think in terms of the 5 year difference between 2 years ago and 3 years from now and that we are dealing with boys (younger than 18)
 - 2nd. 3 years from now ob is twice yb; therefore, his age in 3 years will be an even number and 5 years before that, an odd number
 - 3rd. For our age range of boys identify the odd numbers for ob that could be exactly three times a smaller number: 3, 9, 15, and now match them up with the smaller number for vb: 3-1; 9-3; 15-5
 - 4th. Add 5 to each pair of numbers to see which pair has ob two times yb: 8-6; 14-8; 20-10
 - 5th. 3 years from now ob will be 20 and yb will be 10 that means that now *ob* is 17 and *vb* is 7!

Solve algebraically:

$$X = yb$$
 $Z = ob$

Set up an equation for two years ago that solves for Z in terms of X Z-2 = 3(X-2)

Z-2 = 3X-6

Z = 3X-4

Set up an equation for three years from now that solves for X when the X equivalents are substituted for Z:

Z+3 = 2(X+3)

(3X-4)+3=2X+6

3X-1 = 2X+6

3X = 2X + 73X - 2X = 7

X = 7

Now substitute X=7 into the first equation and solve for Z

$$Z = 3(7) - 4$$

$$Z = 21 - 4$$

$$Z = 17$$

Older Brother is 17 years old; Younger Brother is 7

- 3. You are dealing with the numbers on a clock. When it is 10am, adding seven hours makes it 5pm.
- 4. The total she left altogether is \$12,000.

Focus on adding the fractions together to get the total she left minus the \$1000 dogs' home gift:

Granddaughter = 1/2,Brother = 1/6

Grandson = 1/4 (1/2 granddaughter's share)

1/2 + 1/4 + 1/6 = ? The common denominator of these fractions would be 12. So we can look at this as: 6/12 + 3/12 + 2/12, which equals 11/12. The remainder \$1,000 must be one-twelfth, so the total was \$12,000.
