At our August 17 Club Luncheon, we were joined by Jeff Eagen, District Executive of the Kettle Country District of the Boy Scouts of America - Bay-Lakes Council. He first provided some background saying that Bay-Lakes Council is a youth-serving non-profit organization which provides a Scouting program to over 9,000 youth in Eastern Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, and that the Kettle Country District, which is one of eight districts within this Council, proudly serves Wisconsin's Dodge, Ozaukee, and Washington Counties. Jeff then explained that several Boy Scout Troops in the West Bend area have lost their Chartering (sponsoring) organizations and are now seeking new chartering organizations like an Optimist Club. He then provided info regarding how our Club could become a Charter Organization for Boy Scout Troops by paying a Troop Charter Fee.

Afterwards, Club President Mike Hartwell conducted a survey of Club Members to see if becoming a West Bend Boy Scout Troop Charter Organization is something the Club should do to further fulfill its mission of supporting youth in the West Bend area. A good majority of the survey responses were in favor of the Scouting Charter, but with some questions. At the Club's August 22 Board of Directors Meeting, Mike addressed the questions raised especially about any additional financial commitments beyond the \$200 Charter fee. The Board determined that any additional financing requests would be handled by the Board on a caseby-case basis, and they approved a Board motion to provide \$200 to become a Boy Scout Troops Charter Organization.

- There are nearly 20,000 known species of bees throughout the world; 4,000 of which are native to the United States.
- A single worker honeybee produces approximately 1/12 of a teaspoon of honey in her lifetime. That means around 22,700 bees are needed to fill a single jar of honey!
- Honey bees must tap Two million flowers to make one pound of honey!
