
At our October 19 Club Luncheon, we were

THANKSGIVING

Thanksgiving is an annual national holiday in the United States and Canada celebrating the harvest and other blessings of the past year. Americans believe that their Thanksgiving is modeled on a 1621 harvest feast shared by the English colonists (Pilgrims) of Plymouth and the native Wampanoags.



The American holiday is particularly rich in legend and symbolism, and the traditional fare of the Thanksgiving meal typically includes turkey, bread stuffing, potatoes, cranberries, and pumpkin pie. The holiday is often the busiest travel time of the year, as family members gather with one another.

Plymouth's 1621 Thanksgiving came after a bountiful fall harvest and then a fall hunt for turkeys, geese, and ducks. Their hunt was so successful that upon their return to the settlement, they decided to celebrate all their good fortune. Next, 90 or so Wampanoag made a surprise appearance at the settlement. They contributed venison and fish to the feast, which now also included the fowl, fruits, stews, vegetables, and beer. At this time, since Plymouth had but a few small buildings, people ate outside while sitting on the ground. This was a rather disorderly affair that lasted several days, but it sealed a peace treaty between them that lasted fifty years.
