

Birth to 3 Program

Joining us for lunch on November 16, was Katie Skuban, Coordinator for the Washington County *Birth to Three program*. The Birth to Three program, operated through The Threshold Incorporated, is an early intervention program that supports families in Washington County with children with delays or disabilities under the age of three. It provides in-home therapy services, including Speech and Feeding therapy, Occupational therapy, and Physical therapy, as well Family Education and Counseling. It also contracts with Hear WI and Vision Forward to provide hearing and vision services for children with vision or hearing impairments as well.

On average, it serves almost 500 families per year, with approximately 400 children who are active in the program at any given time. For those children who are enrolled in the program, it collectively conducts over 8,000 visits per year to Washington county families alone. The families come from a variety of socioeconomic backgrounds, and each has their own unique story to tell.
